







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## **Alphabet Animal Tracing Cards**

Our Alphabet Animal Tracing Cards help children develop their fine motor skills, independence, attention-span, self-confidence, problem solving skills, and literacy. It corresponds to Common Core Standards RF.K.1.D, and LK.3.A as children identify and write upper- and lowercase letters.

Please note that the directions contain affiliate links.

#### Prep:

Step 1: Print all pages 5-17 in color or pages 18-30 in black & white.

**Step 2:** <u>Laminate</u> the pages and gather <u>whiteboard markers</u> and <u>whiteboard erasers</u>. We recommend using <u>3mil laminating pouches</u> as they're easier to erase from.

**Step 3:** <u>Cut around</u> the alphabet cards, <u>hole punch</u> in the top left corner and combine with a <u>binder ring</u>. Or use the pages as is.

#### **Directions:**

- **Step 1:** Read the letters on the alphabet card and trace with your finger.
- Step 2: Point to the picture and say it's name. What sound does the picture start with?
- Step 3: Use a whiteboard marker to trace the letters.
  - **Step 4:** For added practice, on a whiteboard / chalkboard / paper, practice writing the letter independently.

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
