

Our Apraxia Speech Cards help children work on articulation. These cards focus on the phonological processes of putting together sounds to form simple words. They're perfect for children who struggle with multiple speech errors and have difficulty putting together words. They help your child to articulate, form sounds, and clearly speak.

These cards are 3x3 and perfect for word walls. They are organized by word structure type.

- 24 consonant-vowel cards (CV, like bow) pages 4-11
- 18 vowel-consonant cards (VC, like ant) pages 12-17
- 36 consonant-vowel-consonant cards (CVC, like bed) pages 18-29

Prep:

Step 1: Print all pages 4-29 in color, double sided. By printing double sided, it prints the card name (i.e. CV / VC / CVC.) on the back of each card.

Step 2: Laminate the pages and cut out the cards on the black lines.

Step 3: Hole punch the top corner and place on a binder ring or store in baggies.


Directions:

Step 1: Say the word to your child and then have them repeat it after you. Have them repeat the sound until it sounds good.


Step 2: Once your child can say the words back to you most of the time with all of their sounds, you will have them start to say the words on their own. Hold up one of the speech cards and ask them what it is. If they say the word well, get really excited and praise them! If they can't, go back to saying the word first and having them repeat after you.
