

Feed Penny Pig

Silly Fun Articulation Game

Penny Pig is a very hungry little pig! She eats an assortment of healthy foods and snacks, as well as *very* silly objects. Children love feeding Penny as they work on language goals. The game can be used with the Articulation "Food" Cards that are included, as well as other speech cards such as free Apraxia Speech Cards for CV, VC, CVCe, CVCV, CVVC words. This game is a favorite in our class and the children enjoy playing over and over again.

Prep:

Step 1: Print pages 4 – 7 in color. Cut out Penny Pig's white mouth area and then laminate all 4 pages (cardstock may be used instead of laminating).

Step 2: Cut the 3 pages of laminated articulation cards along the lines to make articulation feeding cards for the game.

Step 3: Cut around Penny Pig. Cut out the mouth area to create an opened mouth. Attach Penny Pig to a container. You may use any container that is tall enough and will hold the articulation cards when fed to Penny Pig. We used an empty, 1 LB 3.7 oz (559 g) disinfecting wipes container with the label removed. The 1 LB 1 oz (500g) size will work just as well. *Be sure to wash the container thoroughly with soap and water before using.

Step 4: Mark an outline on the container the same size as the mouth opening. Cut out the outline to create a hole in the container for the mouth.

Step 5: Place <u>½" double-sided adhesive dots</u> or a similar adhesive around the cut opening. Hot glue sticks will not hold the laminated paper very well if using a plastic container.

Step 6: Attach Penny Pig with her mouth over the opening. If you're using a disinfecting wipes container, make sure the lid opens toward Penny Pig for easy access to the articulation cards.





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Directions:

Step 1: Choose articulation cards for language goals you wish to target or use all of the cards provided. Ask your child to choose a card, and then ask your child to say the word on the card correctly.

Step 2: Ask your child to feed Penny Pig as they say the words on the cards. For added fun, you may set a timer to see how many words can be said and fed to Penny Pig in 30 seconds. Then, your child can try to beat their own times.

Step 3: Alternate game – Use <u>Articulation Speech Cards</u> to target language goals. Ask your child to say the word on a card and then feed an Articulation "Food" Card of their choice to Penny for each word practiced.

The goal is to use motivating words to practice targeted mouth/articulatory movements. It is okay if children need to use approximations in the beginning. For example, cookie may be said as "tookie", or paddle as "pah-do." As children continue to practice each word, it will get easier for them to say and articulate.



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
