

#### Prep:

**Step 3:** Gather <u>bingo chips</u> or something to place over the pictures as they're called.

#### **Directions:**


Step 1: Give everyone a bingo mat. Place a chip over the 'Happy Thanksgiving' picture in the middle.

Step 2: Hold up a calling card and have the student's place a bingo chip on the matching picture if their mat has it.


Step 3: Continue to hold up the calling cards until someone gets 3 across, 3 down, or 3 diagonal and calls BINGO!


