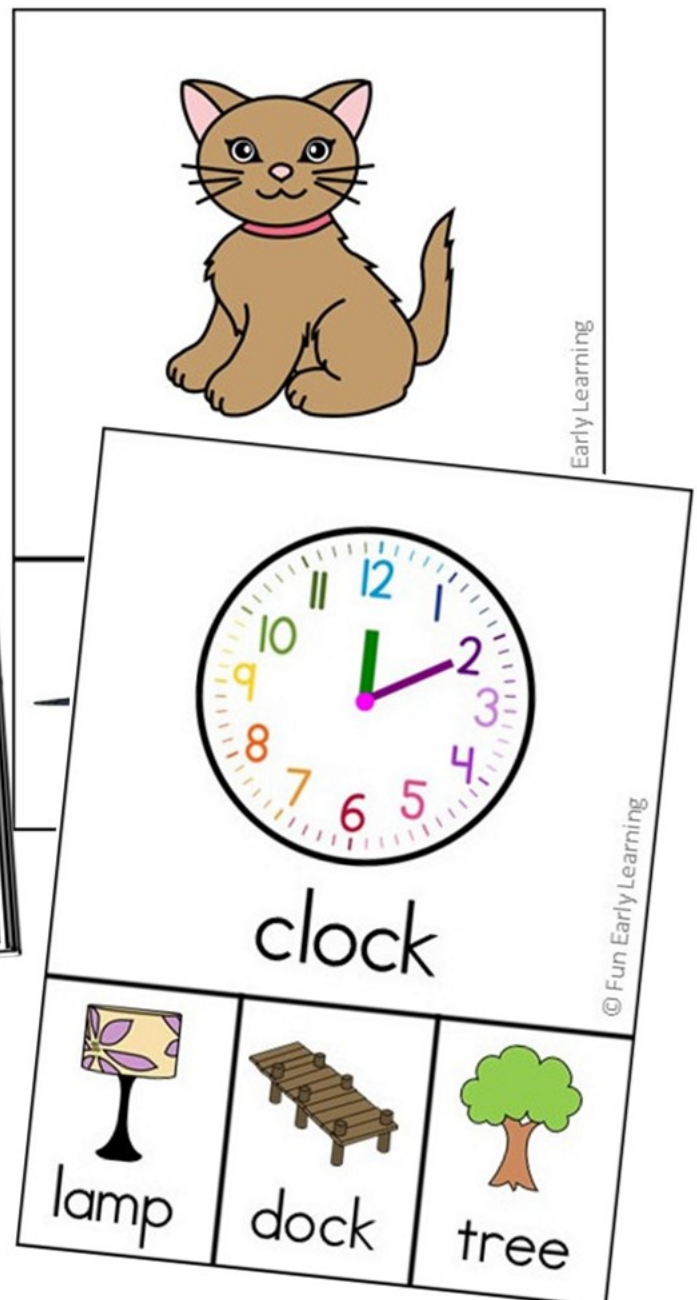
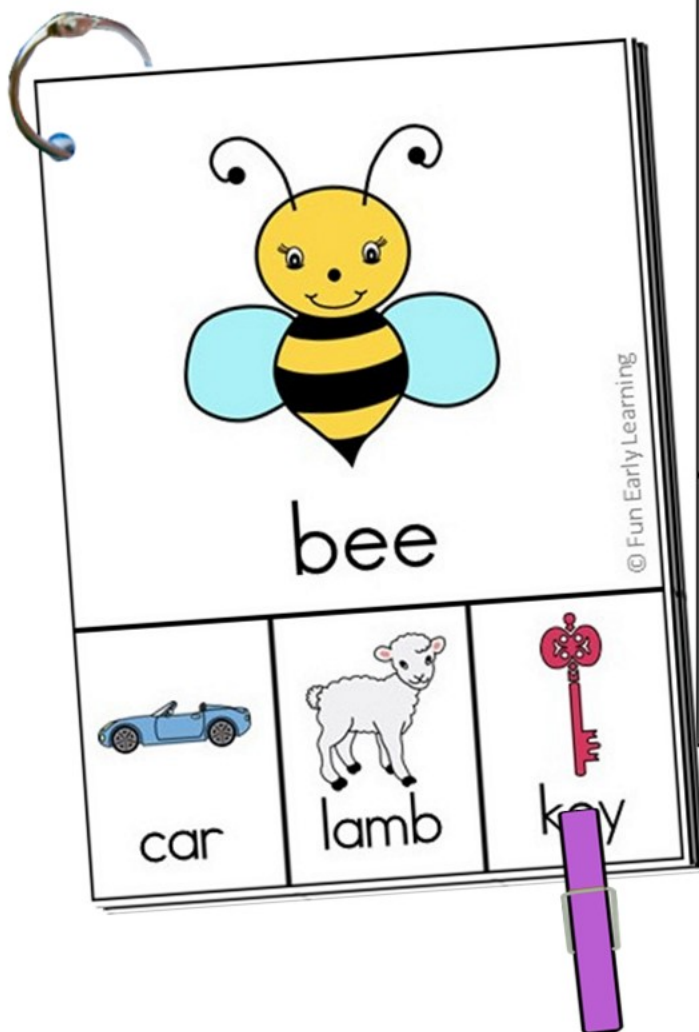


# Rhyming Clip Cards

## Rhyming Clip Cards

### About:

Our Rhyming Clip Cards activity helps children work on their early literacy and rhyming skills! Rhyming teaches children how language works. As they make rhymes, they notice sounds within the words. The ability to recognize and produce rhyming words is an important phonological awareness skill and a great building block to reading.

### Prep:

- Step 1:** Print pages 4-13 in color for the clip cards with words or pages 14-23 in color for the clip cards without words.
- Step 2:** Laminate the pages and cut out the cards following the dotted lines. Pages 4-8 (and 14-19) are CVC rhyming words. The other cards are a bit more difficult. Hole Punch the top left corner and loop on a binder ring or store with a rubber band or in a baggie.
- Step 3:** Gather clothespins to clip on the cards or a whiteboard marker to circle to the rhyme.

### Directions:

- Step 1:** Say the name of the focus picture in the middle of a card. Listen carefully to its sounds.
- Step 2:** Look at the 3 pictures in a row below the focus picture and say their names. Use a clothespin to clip the picture that rhymes with the focus word. For example, for the can picture card, I would say 'fan, tub, bug' – I would then clip the fan because it rhymes with can. (if you're using a whiteboard marker, circle the rhyming word)
- Step 3:** Continue steps 1 and 2 until you have clipped all of the rhymes.

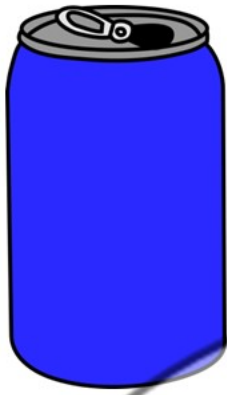

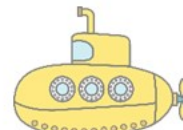

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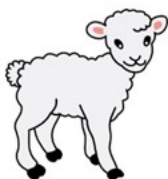
